PPL makes donation to civic partnership

PPL continues to lead all area industries in its support to the Greater Hazleton Area Civic Partnership Scholarship Committee.

The check presented for \$2,500 makes a total of \$10,000 donated by PPL since the start of the program in 1999.

Jack St. Pierre chairs the Technology Scholarship Committee.

The Scholarship Committee is funded by contributions from area industries and concerned citizens.

At this time the Civic Part-

nership is funding two students, one at Penn State Hazleton and one at Lehigh Carbon Community College and is accepting applications for the fall semester of 2003.

The Civic Partnership Scholarship Committee's main goals are to address the lack of skilled specialists and to keep our young people in the Hazleton area after post-secondary education.

The scholarship is open to students enrolled or planning to enroll in one, two or four year educational programs in a certified institution.

In exchange for a threeyear contract with the Civic Partnership to work in the Hazleton area upon graduation, the scholarship will pay \$3000 annually for two years towards the student's education.
