

## HVAC firm selected as Great Valley Young Entrepreneur award winner

The Greater Hazleton Chamber of Commerce and the Greater Wilkes-Barre Chamber of Business and Industry announced that Jason Bellitts, owner of Bellitts HVAC, has been selected as the Great Valley Young Entrepreneur of the Year. The honor, sponsored by Bank of America, is designed to promote the development of future business owners and operators in our region.

Bellitts, 24, is the owner and operator of his company. After working for other large plumbing, heating and cooling companies, Bellitts started his business in 2002.

Bellitts' HVAC installs all makes and models of heating and cooling equipment which includes furnaces that use fuel oil, gas, coal or heat pumps.

Bellitts started working on small jobs until he accumulated enough money to buy a van and equipment in order to accomplish larger, more complex jobs.

While discussing his business with his grandmother and mentioning how it had progressed and where he saw his future in the business, his grandmother wanted to assist him and purchased his first official Bellitts' HVAC work truck. Since then, Bellitts has introduced new equipment and new products to the area.
